In recognition of her work, Patricia is a recipient of the Order of Australia Medal (OAM). She has been a finalist in the ACT Chief Minister's Inclusion Awards on multiple occasions and was named an Iconic Woman Creating a Better World for All by the Women's Economic Forum. She has served as both President and Vice President of the APFACTS Board, is a Global Goodwill Ambassador, and regularly contributes to ABC Radio Canberra. Her writing has appeared in the Canberra Times, HerCanberra, and other leading platforms.

Patricia has also been invited as a panellist for events hosted by Swinburne University, the Women's Leadership Australia Symposium, and the Australian Commonwealth Public Sector's Neurodiversity Community of Practice, further demonstrating her thought leadership in national conversations on neurodiversity, equity, and inclusion.
